

Checklist: N5 Notice — Reason 1

Use this checklist if your landlord gave you an N5 Notice to End Your Tenancy **and they checked Reason 1: interfering with others.**

If you answer **No** to any of the questions on this list, this might show a problem with the eviction notice. Make sure you raise it at any hearing or settlement meeting. If a question does not apply to you, leave it blank.

This is not a complete list of every reason you could use to fight the eviction notice.

It is best if you can get legal help before a hearing or settlement meeting.
