

## How to apply to Ontario Works (OW)

0	Set up a meeting at an OW office	There are 2 ways to set up a meeting: 1. call your local OW office 2. use the online application form
2	Go to your meeting	Family members who live with you should also go to the meeting. Take documents to prove you qualify, such as:
		<ul> <li>rental agreements or rent receipts</li> <li>passports and birth certificates</li> <li>proof of debts, like credit card bills and loans</li> <li>proof of income, like pay stubs and income tax notices</li> </ul>
3	Share your information with the OW worker and complete and sign your application	Usually, you must share information about:  • the size of your family  • jobs and income  • savings and assets  • immigration status  • housing
4	Wait for the decision	OW should tell you what they decide within 4 business days.  If they refuse to give you benefits, get the decision in writing. Ask for an internal review within 30 days of when you get the decision.  Find out more in the flowchart called How to appeal a decision about Ontario Works (OW).
